He spent more than 9 years in Australia, working with world's leading educational and financial organizations, world leading banks like ANZ, American Express, Citigroup, Australian Waters, UNICEF, FAO etc. and also served Government of India in the beginning of his career after clearing SSC competitive Examination. He holds a degree in MBA (Finance) from Melbourne University, Masters in Economics and Bachelors in Education. Presently, he is in the panel of Advisory Board (Trainings) in Wisdom Tree India (New Delhi) and IAPHC (Melbourne) and holds a position as Manager of Sant Nirankari Charitable Foundation (SNCF) where he looks after the Project Management, Liasoning with the corporates, Government agencies and Educational institutions.

How can one communicate with his higher self for instant inspiration and Guidance?

Just be aware of what you are doing and whether this action is going to benefit you, your family, your society, your nation or not. If nothing is going according to your wish; if you are tired of failures again and again in life, if no one is helping you out, if you are unable to find out the solutions to your problems, then its only YOU who is going to help YOU. Just sit with your eyes closed for 10 minutes and see inside yourself, your thoughts and try to listen to your inner voice which is there to help you out. If the problem is coming from your deep inside then the solution must be there itself. This is what I called "Sound of Silence "in my book (Sound of Silence, 2009, ACU Publication, Melbourne)

Do you think that being spiritual can lead you to a successful and happy life and can it help you at work as well?

Spirituality is a key to success in every field. Spirituality develops work ethics in you and refrains you from misconduct. Haven't you seen the misleading advertisements which are selling the products with an aim to earn undue gains? Speaking frankly, do their products really deliver what they are claiming? Here being spiritual means being morally awakened and giving your best to the community. In 2008 my paper "Corporate Saints" was published in Melbourne, Australia, focused on the Corporate ethical values, beneficial for the company itself in the long run.

In your sessions you have always mentioned about being positive. What are the things which always keep you motivated and positive?

Positivity cannot do anything on its own, in fact, no one can change his/her life by just being positive. Let me explain, Positivity is nothing but an "Emotional state of mind" and emotions are momentary i.e. in a particular moment of time you may feel happy and the moment it gets lost, you will start feeling sad. Now to maintain this emotion permanently, you need to support this with "ACTION". There are millions of people in this country with millions of revolutionary ideas which can change the world but why only a few are able to do so? The simple reason is those who convert their POSITIVE THOUGHTS into ACTIONS succeed in their life and the Rest are only day dreamers.

In some of your sessions we have heard you talking about BATTLE of life. Can you please elaborate this for our reader?

Life itself is a BATTLE but the thing is how you take it and how you treat it. In my sessions, I have explained this BATTLE in to six major skills of Life which will help you to conquer your fears. Behavior,

Attitude, Trust, Technology, Language and Ethics. If you master yourself in these techniques, then you will undoubtedly achieve anything in your life.

Students generally face problems in selecting their career. How should one choose his/her career? What are those things one should consider before making any move?

This question requires a full workshop, but anyway, let me sum up. Firstly, we need to understand that unless and until the students plan on their Career Path, they cannot select their career wisely. Recent reports reveal that about 80% university graduates in India are unemployable i.e. they are not fit for the jobs even at the clerical level. Why this is happening? What is missing in a student's life? The gap between Campus and Corporate and the path joining them is called the Career Path, which a student these days is unaware of. You tell me, how many students are being trained in the college to develop their career path, the hurdles they are going to face, and the solutions available? Secondly, we always treat investing in education as investing in business. Education is beyond profits as there are values which cannot be shown in balance sheet. Thirdly, we don't have right Mentors to guide us. Every college should stress upon Mentoring Program which lacks in colleges nowadays. If we go to our Vedic Gurukul systems, they pay more emphasis on Mentoring where pupil learns a lot of skills which are beyond books.

Many Youngsters have diverted their mind from service sector to Business? What tips would you like to give to our upcoming entrepreneurs?

It's really good for an economy to have more businessmen. Before the Britishers came to India. we were less aware of "Service Sector" as the whole society was full of businessmen in different sectors. Every person is a CEO of his own Life and unless and until we know the business management techniques we cannot even manage our life or business. Now it's time when we should identify the entrepreneurship skills in the student's life right at the age of 14-15 years and accordingly we should plan their business career. Why to have more and more degrees when a person wants to run his / her own venture. More and more trainings should be provided in the schools and colleges to identify the business talents in the students and encourage having their own startup.

Everyone talks about women empowerment. How do you react to the women education in India?

Every girl child should be provided with an environment which enables her to learn and have adequate education to make her self sufficient and independent. When a boy is educated, then only a boy is educated, but when a girl is educated then the whole family becomes educated. Going in Vedic era, it reminds me of the women sages who were more powerful than the men viz. Gyatri, Gargi, Maytri and many more.

To all my readers I would just say one thing, "Do WHAT YOU WANT TO DO, DO WHAT YOUR SOUL SAYS. LET YOUR PASSION BECOMES YOUR PROFESSION." No one is going to help you out at the later stage of your life. Hence it is better to have your career path and plan before hand. Everyone is unique, so don't try to become someone else. You are unique and you are awesome. Be Yourself.





राष्ट्र विकास का वास्तविक अर्थ

कहा जा रहा है कि हमारे राष्ट्र का विकास हो रहा है। 16 मई 2014, में जब से हमारे देश में मोदी सरकार आई है तब से राष्ट्र विकास का कार्य तेजी से बढ़ रहा है। वैसे तो आप सबको राष्ट्र विकास का अर्थ मालूम ही होगा, क्या होता है राष्ट्र विकास? अगर मैं कहूँ कि राष्ट्रीय आय का बढ़ना, शिक्षा स्तर का पहले से अच्छा होना, बाजार में नई-नई तकनीको का आना, हमारे देश का डिजिटिलाइजेशन होना मेरा कहना गलत नहीं होगा, क्या ये सब राष्ट्र विकास है? हाँ, इन सबका होना राष्ट्र विकास तो है, परन्तु राष्ट्र विकास का वास्तविक अर्थ नहीं। क्योंिक राष्ट्र विकास का वास्तविक अर्थ होने का मतलब है कि जो विकास आज हो रहा है उसका फायदा हर किसी व्यक्ति को समान रूप से मिले, चाहे वह गरीब हो या चाहे वह अमीर हो। परन्तु क्या आज ऐसा हो रहा है ? नहीं, आज जो अमीर है वह और अमीर होता जा रहा है और जो बेचारा गरीब है वो गरीबी की मार झेल रहा है । दोस्तों क्या आप सभी जानते की हमारा देश विश्व का दूसरा असमानता वाला देश है । जहाँ पर राष्ट्रीय आय का 60% भाग तो देश के 1% अमीरों के पास है और बाकी राष्ट्रीय आये 40% की 99% लोगों में विभाजत किया जाता है । देखा जाये तो आज एक तरफ अमीरों के पास इतना पैसा है कि वे उस को पानी की तरह बहा रहें हैं और दूसरी तरफ बेचारा गरीब दो वकृत की रोटी के लिए भी तरस रहा है। क्या ये विकास है? नहीं, दोस्तों मेरा कहना यह नहीं है हमारा कि राष्ट्र विकास नहीं कर रहा है, तो सरकार 2004-05 में राष्ट्रीय आय का 10.62% शिक्षा पर खर्च कर रही थी , आज वह बढ़ कर 16.01% हो गया है। इसी दौरान लोगो में भी शिक्षा के प्रति जागरूकता आई है। जहाँ 2005–06 में शिक्षा की दर 48.62% थी, आज वह बढ़कर 74% हो गयी है। वैसे तो यह प्रतिशत विकास का संकेत करती है,परंतु दूसरी ओर देखा जाए तो आज बेरोजगारी की दर में 52% से भी ज्यादा पढ़े लिखे लोग बेरोजगार हैं। तो दोस्तों ये कैसा विकास है. कि एक तरफ तो लोगो को शिक्षा के लिए प्रेरित किया जा रहा है और वही दूसरी तरफ शिक्षित लोग बेरोजगार हैं। क्या आप सब यह जानते है, कि हमारे देश में 45 लाख ग्रेजुएट लोग बेरोजगार हैं, इसका मतलब हमारे राष्ट्र का कोई वास्तविक विकास नहीं हो रहा है।अब अगर मैं स्वास्थ्य क्षेत्र की बात करूँ तो आज हमारी सरकार सौभाग्य योजना के अंदर 3000 करोड जन औषधि केंद्र में 800 से ज्यादा बिकने वाली दवाइयों को सस्ती कीमतों पर उपलब्ध करा रही है। जिससे हर गरीब कि इलाज कराया जा सके, वहीं दूसरी और बात की जाए किसी बड़े अस्पताल की, तो वहां के डॉक्टर्स ने तो हाल ही में डेंगू के इलाज पर केवल 7 दिन के 15 लाख लिए हैं। अब आप सभी खुद ये सोच सकते हैं की ऐसे में कोई गरीब क्या अपना इलाज वहाँ करा सकता है? यह कैसा विकास हो रहा है? आज हमारे देश में, कहने को तो राष्ट्रीय आय बढ़ रही है बाजार में नयी — नयी तकनीक आ रही है और कुल उत्पादन भी 275 मिलियन टन हुआ है वहीं दूसरी ओर इन नयी तकनीकों व मशीनरी का इस्तेमाल करने के कारण प्रदूषण बढ़ने से आज हमारे देश में ऐसी—ऐसी बीमारियाँ फैल रही हैं, जिनका इलाज डॉक्टर के पास भी नहीं है। दोस्तों अब आप सबको क्या लगता है कि आज हमारा देश वास्तव में विकास कर रहा है?
